Junior Breeding Sheep: Monday, Feb. 26 - Wednesday, Feb. 28

- Open Show: Tuesday, Feb. 27th
- Junior Show: Wednesday, Feb. 28th
- Breed Changes:
  - Discontinuing Delaine-Merino
  - Finewool Breeds: only breeds accepted in the breed category include Columbia, Corriedale, Delaine-Merino, Targhee
  - Other Registered Breeds: Any breed that does not have its own breed but has registration papers from a breed association.
- New Rule: During the Junior Breeding Sheep Show, each exhibitor will be allowed ONE parent/guardian and ONE AST/CEA within the holding pen area and entrance into the show ring. Additional individuals or fitters are not allowed within the show ring or holding area, with the exception of the photography backdrop.

- Note: All heifers validated starting in June of 2023 must have a validation tag, heifers validated prior to this are grandfathered in and will not require a validation tag. All heifers must be state validated to show.
- Chianina Division: all heifers with a registration paper from the American Chianina Association will show as a Chianina regardless of breed percentage.
- Simbrah Division: only Purebred Simbrah heifers will show in the Simbrah Division. Purebred Simbrah \* and Percentage Simbrah will show as ARB.

#### Current Scrambler Deadlines

- Monthly Reports are due on the 10<sup>th</sup> of every month for the following month. Exhibitors who fail to submit reports every month may become ineligible for the completion bonus.
- August 1: Steer exhibitors must enter validation EID Tag Number in scramble system & Initial Assessment of the Business Plan is due
- September 1: Scramble Certificates, heifer registration papers, and breed essays are due.
- Progress Show: November 4 -5 at the Washington County Expo
  - Open to all current exhibitors in the calf scramble program
  - No fee to attend
  - Heifers are shown by division, steers are shown by weight
  - Entry will be taken via the calf scramble portal; more information will be sent out directly to scramblers and AST/CEA's in early Fall.

#### Super Scramble

19 scramblers will compete for \$42,000 in prize money. The first catch winner from the first 19 rodeo performances will be elgible to return on the last Sunday during the rodeo finals. 9 out of the 19 scramblers will the have the opportunity to catch a calf. The prize money will be distributed as follows:

- 1st Catch: \$10,000

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Catch: \$6,000

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Catch: \$4,000

4<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> Catch: \$2,000 each
 Non-Catchers: \$1,000 each

**New Scrambler Reminders:** 

#### - Calf Scramble:

 Open to 4-H/FFA contstants that have reached their 14<sup>th</sup>, but not their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday on Jan. 1, 2024 and not enrolled beyond the junior year of high school

 Certificate Amount: \$2,250 (\$1,750 used toward purchase of a Breeding Beef Heifer or a Market Steer, \$500 will be awarded at donor social the following year once the project is complete.)

Judging Contests: Certificates are awared in the Dairy Judging and Livestock Judging Contests. Contestants must adhere to all rules set forth in Scramble rules if they accept certificate.

- **NOTE:** Scramble Cerftificate winners who intially accept and then decline their Scramble Certicate, may be <u>barred from exhibiting/participating</u> in HLSR competitions/shows. This is at the discretion of Show Management.

Late fees apply after this date

- Dec. 2<sup>nd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup>: \$250 late fee per club/chapter

- After Dec. 5th: \$500 per entry

#### **Entry Forms**

Individual Show and Contests entered via the HLSR Junior Show Entry Portal:

- Indemnities: Only one indeminity form will be used for all individual shows/contests to simplify the entry process, all indemnity forms must be notorized. **Note:** *Indemnity forms for Ag Mechanics contestants should be brought to the show on the day of move-in.*
- Entry Forms: All exhibitors/contestants will need to use the Junior Show Entry Form, for some contests including Ag Mechanics, Poster Board, and Video Contest, an additional form will be need to be completed as well.
- W-9's: A paper W-9 will be required for all exhibitors/contestants.

#### **Judging Contest Entry**

Entry for team related judging contests will be taken via judgingcard.com. Entries will open on October 17<sup>th</sup> and are due on Feb. 1<sup>st</sup>. No Late Entries will be accepted! Contests that are entered as an indivdual only including Ag Public Speaking, Ag Science Fair, Poster Board Contest, and Video Contest, will continue to enter in the HLSR Junior Show Entry Portal with a deadline of Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>. No paper entry form is required. Indemnity forms should not be mailed to the show, please bring the completed indemntiy forms to the contest.
