




AWARDS PROGRAM

^{**}Students may apply for Proficiency awards, Lone Star FFA Degree, and Star Awards beyond the chapter level based upon their completed record book for their FFA experience. Requirements for these awards are located in the National FFA Manual and the Texas FFA Degree Selection Procedures. This information is kept on file in the Ag science teacher's office. Please contact Ms. Hartman or Ms. Mulhern or Mr. Lux if you wish to apply for advanced awards or for further information.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

The 2022 Graduating Schulenburg FFA members were awarded over \$189,453 in FFA RELATED scholarships!

1. Scholarship Opportunities through Texas FFA Association Scholarship Programs

Graduating seniors apply during the Spring Semester at the District Degree Check. Scholarship is based on academic rank (must be in top 25% for Houston, top 50% for the others), SAT/ACT scores (minimum 950 on SAT, minimum of 20 on ACT), and FFA activities.

2. National FFA Scholarships

Graduating seniors apply for various scholarships. Students may obtain an application from www.ffa.org, the National FFA website. Eligibility requirements and award amounts are listed as well.

3. Ag Science Fair Competition

The Ag science Fair offers the opportunity for members to demonstrate their Ag science abilities through a science fair competition. Scholarships are awarded on the state and national levels.

4. Proficiency and Star Awards

Students can obtain various scholarships through participation in advanced awards. Students who win on the state and national levels will receive scholarships.

5. Leadership Development Evnets

Students that are members of state champion teams are awarded a \$250 scholarship from the Texas FFA Foundation upon graduation. The Texas FFA Foundation works to raise funds to provide programs and scholarships for FFA members and provide support to chapters acorss the state.

6. Career Development Events

Students can win various scholarships at various contests if they win high individual honors. Additionally, colleges scout judging team members and offer those students with exceptional abilities scholarships to judge at their universities or colleges, respectively.

7. Local Scholarships (Schulenburg FFA, SJLS Supporters, Schulenburg Young Farmers, ETC.)

Graduating seniors can apply for this local scholarship to help defray expenses of higher education.

SCHULENBURG FFA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This program was established to reward active membership with some scholarship money at the end of the member's FFA career.

- Students can earn a \$250 scholarship from the Schulenburg FFA upon graduation. Students must show proof of enrollment to receive the scholarship.
- This scholarship must be used within the first year of college after high school graduation.

Starting with the Class of 2023 the following requirements will be used to determine Schulenburg FFA Scholarships.

- Students must have earned or be receiving the Lone Star FFA Degree.
- Students must participate in both fundraisers each year but met requirements of Fall Fundraising (25 items) or BBQ Chicken Dinner Tickets sold (20) all four years of high school.

CDE Dress for contests

- Buttoned down or Polo type **collared** shirt
- Nice Jeans or Slacks that fit at the waist and are free of fading or holes (no capris or rolled jeans).
- Closed toe shoes are required
- Appropriate caps or hats for the contest

Official Dress for Livestock Shows

- Buttoned down or polo type collared shirt
- Nice Jeans that fit at the waist and are free of fading or holes.
- Closed toe shoes are required NO Tennis Shoes.
- Belt should be worn
- No caps or hats
- Hair should be pulled away from face and look orderly.

In addition to the previous guidelines, the Schulenburg ISD Student Dress Code is in effect at all FFA activities and competitions. If it is inappropriate to wear to school, it is inappropriate to wear to an FFA activity.

FFA FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

The FFA provides many activities throughout the year that require money. The entry fees for contests, community service projects, the food and refreshments at meetings, animal projects assistance, and supplies for the banquet require a large sum of money. You are asked to participate in whatever fundraising activity that we have. The more money that our group makes, the more activities we can provide to you. Each family is asked to have the first member of the family sell 25 items and 10 for additional family members.

This year, as in the past, we are selling nutritional food products. We will be offering Seitz's fruit, meat and cookie dough. These products will be delivered in time for Thanksgiving and Christmas orders. These products are also great for selling to large businesses and families for Christmas presents.

In addition, you <u>MUST</u> sell at least 25 items to be eligible to go on the end of the year trip or to exhibit a LIVESTOCK project at the Schulenburg Jr. Livestock Show or Major stock show. Members may enter a "buy out agreement" with the chapter.Members may pay \$5.00 per item they are short of 25 or \$125 to "Buyout" of selling any fall fundraiser items. For every 15 items a student sells, their name will be entered into a raffle for various prizes. <u>Students are only eligible to win 1 of the prizes.</u> <u>Students are only entered for actual items sold. "Buyout" items DO NOT count towards the raffle.</u>

The FFA will also be in charge of the concession stands for all home football games in August and September. We encourage everyone to come and help out at the concession stands. The FFA will also host its annual BBQ chicken dinner in April and run the Hamburger Stand at the Rodeo during the Schulenburg Festival. We need all members and parents to be actively involved in fundraising in order to fund all of our activities throughout the year.

SCHULENBURG FFA POINTS PROGRAM

Outstanding Leadership Awards are given to all members earning 350 POINTS from the school year. All FFA members who have received 350 points will be able to attend an End of Year field trip with the chapter. In order to attend State FFA Convention in the summer, FFA members must either be on the incoming officer team, receiving an award or have accumulated a minimum of **350 POINTS** from the school year. A deposit will be required to attend State FFA Convention, depending on your number of points.

SCHULENBURG FFA HISTORY

Schulenburg FFA was charted October 22, 1930. Throughout the chapter's history, members have been competitive in all aspects of FFA. Schulenburg boasts several state, area and district officers. Members today are continuing to follow in the footsteps of excellence that have lain before them.

FFA DUES

Schulenburg ISD is participating in the Affiliation Fee program offered through National FFA. This program pays the FFA dues for every student enrolled in an Ag Science Course in grades 8-12. Jr. FFA is not involved in this program and will have dues of \$15.00 per member.

FFA JACKETS

FFA Jackets can be purchased for \$75.00. This will include your jacket and a tie or scarf. Orders will be placed on the 1st Friday each month throughout the year and the orders will then be placed with the National FFA Supply Service. Please allow 4-6 weeks for delivery. All members are encouraged to purchase an FFA Jacket. Please contact Mrs. Mulhern to order FFA Jackets.

${f O}$ fficer ${f I}$ nformation

Greenhand FFA Officers

As a first year FFA member who that is enrolled in the Principles of Ag, Food and Natural Resources class, you have the opportunity to run for a Greenhand Officer Position. This will help to prepare you for future leadership positions within the FFA. 2020-2021 officer elections will be held in the Fall of 2020.

Greenhand Officer Election Requirements:

- Currently enrolled in Principles of AFNR class
- Complete and turn in an Election Flyer by the deadline stated on application
- Complete the election process as stated on the Election Info packet
- Purchase an FFA jacket (\$75)
- Be an active participant in Schulenburg FFA Activities

Chapter FFA Officers

Chapter officers serve a vital function in FFA. By taking a major leadership role, these students grow from the experience and benefit the chapter. It should be the officers' goal to lead by example and encourage other members to participate in chapter activities. Requirements to become a Chapter officer are listed below:

- Obtain the Greenhand Degree and be in good standing with the Chapter and Schulenburg High School.
- The candidate should maintain a passing grade for each 9-week period set by the school board throughout the entire year.
- Each candidate must participate on a leadership or judging team during the year
- A chapter officer candidate must have earned **250 points** prior to the election.
- A chapter officer candidate must turn in all paper work by set deadline.
- A three-part process will elect chapter officers. Each portion of the process will be equally weighted.
- Must comply with UIL 'No Pass No Play" Guidelines.

Officers are given a detailed Handbook with instructions and criteria in the Spring before elections are held.

District FFA Officers

District officers need to motivated to lead the district membership at various events throughout the year. Horizon Officers are elected at the District Convention. Officers serve for one year. The following are requierments for District Officers:

- All district officers shall have attained the chapter FFA degree; and be concluding their sophomore or junior year of high school when their respective chapter nominates them.
- A Horizon District FFA Officer may not hold an Area Officer position during the same term being served as a District Officer.
- District Officers are required to comply with the District 1 Officer Guidelines during their year of service. Each district officer candidate must submit a Horizon District FFA Officer Contract prior to running for office. This form shall be turned in at the time the candidate submits their application.
- Shall be in good standing with their chapter and their school and must comply with UIL 'No Pass No Play" Guidelines.

Area FFA Officer

Area XI officers are required to perform on a vigorous and continuous basis. Therefore, it is necessary that those who aspire to become officers are highly qualified, motivated, able and willing to perform. Please read and study the major qualifications and prerequisites very closely.

- Meet the minimum qualifications to serve as an Area Officer established by the Area XI
 Constitution (Hold the Chapter Degree, not serve as a District and Area Officer at the same
 time, at time of election be going into their Senior year of high school).
- Receive approval from their local FFA Chapter and Advisor.
- Register candidacy by established deadline.
- Submit a \$50.00 filing fee.
- Submit an Area Officer Application by established deadline.
- Participate in all applicable Rounds and Phases of the selection process
- All Area Officers must be in good standing with their chapter and comply with UIL "No Pass, No Play" Guidelines.

Texas FFA State Officers

The primary responsibility of a state officer is to serve the Texas FFA Association in local, district, area, and state activities in a way that will inform, motivate, and inspire FFA members, advisors, state staff, teachers and others to achieve the mission, strategies and core goals of the organization and to represent the state association in state meetings according to board policy and at the direction of the State Executive Director and the state FFA staff.

- All candidates must go through a selection process consisting of interviews by nominating committee and election by popular vote. Must hold state degree at time of election
- A candidate may be eligible to run for state officer through the second convetion folling their graduation from high school.
- Represent the Texas FFA Association at chapter, district, area and state activities as requested by local advisors and area coordinators within the scope of Texas FFA Association officer and travel policies.
- Serve as a National FFA Convention and Expo delegate on behalf of the Texas FFA
 Association and fulfill all responsibilities therewith in accordance to the directives of the
 National FFA Organization and its staff and/or volunteers.

SCHOOL POLICIES AND PRODUCURES

The opportunity to participate in the Schulenburg FFA is a privilege extended to SISD students. The member is subject to state law, school district policies, school rules and regulations, the Schulenburg FFA Constitution and By-laws, and University Interscholastic League (UIL) rules. Schulenburg ISD policy governs all trips taken by FFA members. Any student found in violation of these policies will be disciplined accordingly.

No Pass, No Play

Any FFA member or Jr. FFA member that is competing in FFA events or missing school for FFA events MUST be eligible to do so according to UIL rules. The rule of NO PASS, NO PLAY does pertain to FFA activities. You must be passing all of your classes at each 6 eligibility check in order to participate in FFA activities.

DISTRICT DRUG TESTING POLICY

Any FFA member or Jr. FFA member that is competing in FFA events or missing school for FFA events MUST be eligible to do so according to UIL rules. The rule of NO PASS, NO PLAY does pertain to FFA activities. You must be passing all of your classes at each 6 eligibility check in order to participate in FFA activities.

OVERNIGHT TRIPS

Participation in the Schulenburg FFA places a student in a position of recognition and often bestows the position of role model upon the member. Any student who elects to accept the privilege of participating in the Schulenburg FFA must recognize that he/she is a representative of the school and district, and will be held to a higher standard of conduct than that applied to the general student body. This applies to school related and non-school related activities.

- Students will follow directions given by Advisors, as well as adult chaperones.
- Students will conduct themselves in a proper manner at all times.
- Students will stay with the group at all times.
- Students will not leave the hotel or site of activity for any reason.
- Students will follow all curfew times. Lights out will be at the discretion of the advisors.
- Students must stay in the room assigned to them.
- Female students will not be allowed in rooms of male students. Male students will not be allowed in rooms of female students.
- Students will wear official dress, except when notified by the Advisors. Schulenburg ISD dress code is in effect at all times.

<u>Violations to these guidelines will not be tolerated.</u>
